A successful year

We are reaching more people than ever across Wales with our range of services. We recognise that there are people waiting, but a lot of work is going on behind the scenes to ensure that we are building resources.

We are on target to achieve 47 new guide dog partnerships this year across the whole of Wales with the co-operation of other Guide Dogs teams. Our My Guide service has helped 113 people including friends and family members. Our Habilitation Specialists have worked with 60 children and young people, and we've delivered orientation and mobility services to 80 people.

Staff news

We are all set to welcome a new GDMI to our team. Sian Menai Jones, a Welsh speaker, is originally from Pwllheli, but has been working with Guide Dogs in Forfar and Welwyn. She replaces Richard Llewelyn, who has moved to the Bristol team.

Two new members of staff have joined the Guide Dogs Cymru team as Operations Support Co-ordinators. Rebecca Newton and Anne Davies are based at our centre in St Mellons alongside Charlotte James and supervisor Natasha Maskall.

An experienced orientation and mobility specialist has joined us. Steve Trust replaces Ann Mudd, who has returned to GDMI duties. We also welcome back Samantha Paoloni, habilitation specialist, who is returning from maternity leave to rejoin the Children and Young People's Services team at the start of December.

Christmas arrangements

We've been advised that December 17 will be the last day to order dog food for guaranteed pre-Christmas delivery. Please make sure that you order enough food for the holiday period.

The Guide Dogs Cymru office will shut early from 1pm on both Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. If you need to make contact urgently on either afternoon, the out of hours number will be 0345 143 0127. On other days, the Guide Dogs Cymru team will be contactable on the normal office number, although we will have reduced staff over the festive period.
