
**Donate –** make a one-off or monthly donation to Guide Dogs. Every penny donated will go towards training our pups to become life-changing guide dogs.

# Priya's story



It wasn't until adulthood and the birth of her daughter Lucy, that Priya knew she had to make changes; she felt extremely anxious leaving the house by herself with a pram, and her increased sight loss was making it harder to safely judge distances.

Priya applied for a guide dog, as she felt this would give her the freedom she needed to go out more.

"I think it was the hardest time for me emotionally, but I knew I had to do this for my daughter's sake."

Priya and her current guide dog, Sidney, have been together for five years and



developed a strong bond. They walk to work and to the park, use public transport across London, and go to yoga and dance classes.
