Getting there

Address: Sutton Park, Park Road, The Royal Town of Sutton Coldfield, B74 2YT.

The Event Hub will be in the field next to the visitor centre. Please use the Town Gate entrance.

Parking is available here but is limited. Where possible please car share or use public transport. The postcode for satnav users to this entrance is B73 6BU.

If you're using public transport, it's a short walk to the main entrance from either the bus station in central Sutton Coldfield or the Sutton Coldfield rail station.

You can also park at The Gracechurch Centre for £1, which is a short walk away from the start.

Event day schedule:

10am - Event Hub opens

Come say hello, have a look at our stalls and drop off your bag!

10.50am - Warm-up


You don't need to sign in, but make sure you arrive in time for our fun warm-up to get you prepared.

During her time at training school, Rosie consolidated the skills that she had previously learnt with her puppy raiser, and she also learnt new skills specific to her future role as a guide dog. Rosie was introduced to the guiding harness, learnt how to avoid obstacles, and learnt how to locate objects such as a chair or crossing box.

Bringing your dogs

Dog care and welfare is at the forefront of everything we do. We ask all attendees to please follow these guidelines as there will be guide dogs and pet dogs attending the event.

When a guide dog is in their white guiding harness it means they're working, so it's very important that you don't distract them by touching, feeding or talking directly to the dog.

Please always ask the owner if they're happy for you to interact or talk to their dog before doing so.

If you're planning to bring your pet dog:

- We ask that you only bring one pet dog per participant, and make sure you always have full control.
- All dogs need to be kept on a lead throughout the event. Please don't use a flexi lead.
- All dog waste needs to be cleared up and correctly disposed of throughout the event. Please bring your poo bags with you on the day.
- If your dog is planning to take part in the race with you, please make sure your dog is fit healthy and able.
- If your dog becomes stressed during the run or within the Event Hub, it's important that they don't continue. Please speak with a member of our Events Team who can help direct you to a calm area.
- Please don't bring your dog if she is in season.
