Early Years Fund Race blindfolds

1. With adult help, cut out a mask for each child along the pink dotted line.
2. On the blank reverse of the mask, children draw how they might be more inclusive or draw some of the people/dogs introduced in the assembly. Alternatively, they can glue on a multi-sensory collage to reflect that children with vision impairment might make more of using their fingers to touch, ears to hear and noses to smell.
3. Make two small holes on each side of the mask where the pink circles are marked.
4. Thread some elastic, string or ribbon through the holes to tie the mask around the child's head.
