Continuing training

Once we resumed taking dogs onto public transport it was vital for me to test Archie's reaction to travelling after a period of no practise due to COVID-19. I closely observed his body language to assess if he let out stress signals and if he was a good traveller. Archie was initially a bit wary when we took the bus for the first time - but on the way back after a free run he settled well. By the end of that week, he was happy to lie down resting his head on my foot for the whole bus journey... praise and treats helped!

Archie also loves travelling in my car and doesn't mind sharing the space with his friends, fellow dogs-in-training Violet and Idris. Soon, I'm hoping to take him to central London for a train ride and a dog-friendly ice-cream.

Onwards and upwards

One of Archie's best qualities is that I know what to expect from him. He puts his harness on without hesitation, waits for me to get ready, and his attention is easy to maintain regardless of what distractions are around him. Now that he gets a regular working opportunity in a harness, he has a better understanding of what it is expected from him in that situation. Archie knows that he will get rewarded in food and praise during a walk and time to relax or play just after it. The consistency of his speed has improved, and it is such a nice feeling having a dog who is sound in every situation and is alert when the streets get crowded or we go to a brand-new destination. I am so happy with the progress Archie has shown in his training.
