Learning fast

Over the last few months we have been taking Archie to puppy classes to learn basic obedience skills.









He's progressing well and has already mastered important commands such as 'sit', 'wait' and 'stay'. When we are out and about Archie loves to introduce himself to other dogs but his recall is brilliant, so we know he will come straight back.

Being a typical Labrador, Archie is driven by his stomach and can be a little impatient when it comes to food. We've been teaching him to have more patience through whistle feeding, where we place his food down, ask him to 'wait', and then blow the whistle to let him know he can have his food.

We've been exposing Archie to lots of new environments such as supermarkets, train stations and cafés.
