Bailey makes himself at home


We had a smooth start with Bailey as he settled very easily into life with us. He has a very laid-back and cuddly personality and often attempts to give his love to Edmund, our pet cat, who he adores but the feeling is not quite mutual! Bailey also shares his home with older puppy in training, Charlie. Being a typical toddler, Bailey always follows him around and tries to get him to play!

Bailey's signature move is to empty the whole toy box to dig out his favourite soft toys, which are the ones with big, floppy ears – perfect for chewing! Rope toys are also cherished by Bailey and he will spend hours undoing the knots.









Learning new skills

We have been taking Bailey to regular puppy classes, where he is making great progress learning basic obedience skills. He has mastered the 'sit' and 'down' commands and is now learning the 'touch' command, which he will use later in his training to identify objects such as the button on a pedestrian crossing.

We are currently working on Bailey's traffic awareness as

he can get a little nervous and pull in towards us when he sees a large vehicle approaching on a narrow footpath. We are spending time building his confidence by sitting and watching cars and lorries go past.
