Gentle girl

Bella has limitless amounts of energy and when it's playtime her lively personality comes through! Although George the giraffe toy has now gone out of favour, she still adores her green fluffy hippo and has a new rope toy which she loves to play tug of war with. Bella still loves playing with the children and she is always so gentle with them, which is a true testament to her good nature.

Making progress

We've seen a huge improvement in Bella's patience over the last few months. She settles quickly when we sit in coffee shops









and no longer pulls on her lead when we are out walking together. Bella's focus has also improved as she is no longer distracted by other dogs – no easy feat for any dog and so we are super proud of her!

Bella has been mastering her basic obedience commands such as 'sit' and 'stay'. I've taught Bella to go to her bed on command and also to 'drop it' when I need her to let go of something she is holding in her mouth. I'm so impressed by how quickly she picks up new commands, which will help her through her journey to become a guide dog.

One challenge we've faced due to Bella's playful personality, is teaching her not to be distracted by other dogs' tennis balls when out on walks.

Training – Puppy to qualified guide dog

It takes around 20 months of training to transform a newborn pup into a qualified guide dog.

The pups learn basic commands and are introduced to new surroundings with their Puppy Walker.

They then venture on to Guide Dogs Training School, where they learn



the foundation tasks required of a guide dog. The final stages of training focus on their partnership with a new owner, where they learn specific skills tailored to their owner's specific needs.
