66 Hello, it's Fran here, Coco's Puppy Walker. 99 I've been puppy walking for almost 20 years and Coco is the 16<sup>th</sup> pup I've had so far. All of my pups have been amazing, which meant Coco had big boots to fill, but she's exceeded my expectations.

Puppy walking is very rewarding, it almost becomes a way of life! When I'm out and about I love seeing Coco bring smiles to people's faces. You get a lot of people talking to you about the pups, which makes puppy walking very social. It has given me a greater understanding of what it's like to live with sight loss and how owning a guide dog changes your life.

### Being part of the family

Coco settled into the home immediately! We have a six-year-old golden retriever called Deano who has shown Coco the ropes. Coco's definitely bonded with me; she's very intuitive and when she looks at you, you can tell she's trying to work out what she can do to help or please you. However, she also has a fun personality, and can be a cheeky monkey at times. Even early in the morning she bounces around excited for her walk!

#### **Toys and training**

Coco has a few favourite toys. In particular, she likes a sheep toy that has a rattle inside it – she loves to chuck it about as it makes a noise. However, her all-time favourite toy is a soft duck that she sleeps with.

Coco is a bright pup and has learnt so much in such a short time. So far, she's mastered all her basic obedience skills, such as waiting for the whistle sound to eat her food and the 'sit' and 'wait' commands. We've even taught her to look at a bucket in order to get a treat – this is helpful for guide dog owners when they need to take their pups to the vet. Recently, we've been teaching Coco not to jump on the sofa when she wants to come for a cuddle and I'm already seeing an improvement.
