She passed with flying colours and settled in well with the other family, even at night. The other Puppy Raiser said she enjoyed having Coco stay and emphasised how loving she is. It's lovely to see that Coco has confidence when she's away from me, which means she should adapt well when going to training school.

Previously Coco used to jump on the sofa but has gotten a lot better. Coco reminds me a bit of a lamb, one minute she's on the floor the next she's springing up!

## Visiting new places

Coco is fine when around loud noises such as trains and building work. Recently I took her into Newbury, and she was fine around the buses and lorries. Instead of being nervous, Coco is more curious and likes to take a look at her surroundings. When staying with the other Puppy Raiser, Coco experienced being around builders with scaffolding. Coco entertained the builders and loved following them around!

Although I've been restricted in the places I can take Coco, she's enjoyed lots of nice walks around the village. We've explored different routes on our lead walks which has provided a great opportunity to experience new things such as waste skips outside of houses, and people working on their garden.
