Grace is such a lovely pup – full of mischief and energy, and she loves learning. One of her favourite things to do is chase our pet dog Elsie around the garden. She will do anything I ask, especially when she knows a tasty treat is waiting for her. Grace's favourite toy is anything that big sister Elsie is playing with – I'm sure many parents know that feeling!

They love playing together in the sandpit and agility tunnel in our back garden. One of my favourite things is hiding a toy in the sandpit. Grace will dig it up and zoom around the garden with it.

One of Grace's funniest quirks is that every morning she takes out all her toys and blankets from her 'bedroom'; it's our sign that she's woken up and is ready to start the day. At the end of each day, Grace lets us know when she's ready to go to bed by giving us a five-minute cuddle. Then, after she has finished, she takes herself off to bed – it's the sweetest thing!

Grace picks everything up so quickly and is a joy to train. She's so observant and as soon as I reach for her treat bag, she sits down hoping to get one. I've been teaching Grace the cues 'sit', 'stand' and 'place' which she's mastered so quickly. Grace has also been on her first car journey wipth big sister Elsie. Having Elsie there helped reassure her that the car is a safe place to be. I've only taken her on a few short journeys but since that first trip she has been fantastic!


Grace is very polite and anytime we meet someone new, she sits down and patiently waits for them to come close and give her a fuss; it's adorable.
