Hello, it's Wayne here, Grace's Puppy Raiser.

Since your first Pupdate, Grace has grown so quickly, she's now taller and still so good-natured!

She's always on the go, finding new ways to amuse herself while our pet Labrador Elsie prefers to sleep. She likes to play with her octopus and dinosaur soft toys, or any toy Elsie picks up first! But ear scratches and tummy tickles are her favourite: if you stop, she'll look around, asking for more. She's so expressive!

New skills

Grace has very good food manners and she won't touch Elsie's food. After she finishes her meal, she'll bring you her empty dish if you don't pick it up first! She likes to help in this way; when the post arrives through the letterbox, she collects letters occasionally, and lately she's been fetching my slippers in the hall just before I arrive home. My wife Mandy has started taking it as a signal to put the kettle on!

Whilst this is an adorable trait, we'll be working with Grace to reduce this behaviour as moving personal items around would be challenging for a future owner with sight loss.

Grace is great at grooming and the bucket game is very helpful when I brush her fluffy coat: she has learnt that when she focuses on the bucket, she gets a treat, and I'll keep brushing her. If she looks away, it's her way of saying it's time for a break. Cleaning her eyes and ears is very easy too, she sits so patiently while I do it.

New people and places

Grace is doing really well when out and about, after an initial burst of energy she settles nicely. She walks beautifully on a lead and we are building up to a TTouch harness as she did so well adjusting to her puppy coat. The TTouch harness allows multiple points of contact with her body, helping her to comfortably interpret different physical signals.

I've also introduced her to the bus. At first, she was a little apprehensive, but now she sits and waits nicely. When we arrive at the supermarket, she's so good and calm. Sometimes at cafés she can seem a little confused, but when I start to get her mat and toys out of her bag, she understands it's time to settle.

What is PREP?

Puppy Raising for Excellent Partnerships (PREP) is our bespoke puppy-raising programme that guide dog pups follow while living with their puppy raisers. PREP was designed in consultation with volunteers, staff, training behaviour consultants and canine research staff. It's based on Positive Reinforcement Training (PRT) which focuses on rewarding good behaviour and creating positive associations with new experiences. PREP treats each pup as an individual and helps to support their physical, behavioural, and emotional development.
