Adjusting her training

We've also been reinforcing Hope's ability to stay calm and focused when we've had barbeques with friends by keeping her close to us rather than getting distracted by the other dogs. She's even gotten used to us wearing face masks!

Last time I mentioned that Hope was a bit excitable on the lead, but I'm pleased to say she has greatly improved. She is very good at knowing that when I put her training jacket on it's time to work, so now when she's wearing the jacket she doesn't pull at all!

Future plans

When the restrictions began to ease, we took Hope to the supermarket again where she remembered the skills we'd been working on previously, such as settling under the checkout area whilst I packed. Hope really made us laugh as the only thing that bothered her were the two metres distancing stickers on the floor; she'd obviously not seen them before so kept stopping at all of them! In the next few weeks, we'll hopefully start visiting busier supermarkets to help build up her confidence and possibly walk to the local train station so she can familiarise herself with the noise.

Overall, Hope is a very happy and content pup and she's always willing to practise something over again until she masters it. She loves to curl up in her bed and rest her head on her soft toys like a pillow; although we recently found her resting on my husband's guitar having a snooze!
