Judy

has made excellent progress



Hello, it's Mike and Sally here, Judy's Puppy Raisers. We've been preparing Judy for training school.

Judy is a delight to have around our home. She is a very enthusiastic, energetic character and seems to have a zest for life. Judy is the third golden retriever that we've raised, and she is definitely the liveliest! She loves to carry her toys around the house with her; she's got a new squeaky burger toy that she adores!

Overcoming challenges

In your last Pupdate, we mentioned that Judy was struggling with her dog distraction. She loves saying hello to other dogs and would pull on the lead to get to them when out and about. We're really pleased to report that this is much improved! We've started using a T-Touch harness with her, which is where the lead is clipped to the harness on the front of the chest instead of on the collar, relieving pressure from the dog's neck and helping them move in a balanced way. The T-Touch harness has helped Judy tremendously as she will now stand and look but won't pull. She'll then look at us and we'll reward her with a treat to reinforce the behaviour.

Judy has also had some challenges with bus journeys. The buses where we live are quite small and the bendy country lanes make for a bumpy ride! We've worked very hard with her to make bus journeys a positive experience. We started off by only taking her on short journeys along fairly straight roads and slowly built up the journey length and progressed to more country lane routes. We tend to sit at the front of the bus where there is more space for Judy, as she has long legs and likes to be able to stretch out! She will now settle herself under my legs quite happily. We've gotten to know our local bus driver well and she has been fantastic at allowing us to train. When Judy sees a bus now, she wants to get on!







Looking to the future

We will really miss Judy when she goes to training school. We're so used to her always being around, and the house will be a lot quieter without her! It's always sad when the puppies leave us but it's wonderful to know that they're going on to do something amazing.
