Lola is an absolute pleasure to have around. She is such a happy pup and loves playtime. Her playfulness is infectious! Her new favourite toy is a pink furry pig, which I gave her for her birthday. She absolutely adores it and enjoys a good game of fetch with it. Whilst many dogs would get bored after a while, Lola can go on playing for ages; it doesn't take much to entertain her.

Lola has been in season recently, so we've been spending a lot of time at home practising her social skills and providing her with lots of enrichment activities, such as snuffle mats. Food is hidden within a mat that has long fleece strips attached. This encourages her to find the food by sniffing it out and makes it a fun and rewarding activity for her. Before her season, she and I were going out lots and now that she's finished, we'll be gradually getting out and about once more.

Preparing for training school

I've been working with Lola to prepare her for training school, and I'm really pleased with her progress. She now travels by bus regularly and has no problems with this at all. She's also happy to travel by car and jumps in and out easily. She's such a good girl! We've been on a train once and she was beautifully behaved; not at all bothered by the strange sounds or new environment.

Lola and I have been continuing to visit new places. We regularly travel to a nearby town to explore unfamiliar sights and scents, and she takes this all in her stride. She walks confidently on the lead and seems to enjoy taking in her surroundings.

Lola does tend to get excited when meeting new people, so I've been working on teaching her to remain calm and keep all four paws on the ground! I've been leaving her alone when she's excitable and then rewarding her when she's calm. This seems to be working well and she's making steady progress. She's less fidgety when in public but likes to have something to do or look at, otherwise she can get bored. I'll be continuing to work on this with her in the coming months.

I am confident that Lola has a bright future ahead of her. I would love for her to be paired with someone who has the patience and the desire to play with her lots! She is so confident when out and about and I think she will be a fantastic companion to someone with a busy lifestyle.
