
Hello, it's Richard here, Margo's Puppy Raiser.

Vinny is still a part of the Guide Dogs family and now helps me to raise future life changers and attends fundraising events with me.

Margo will live with me for around 12-16 months, and during this time, I will teach her basic skills which she will then build upon when she starts training school. The aim is to build up a 'bank' of positive associations for Margo in both new and familiar places, which will help her remain calm when she experiences something different.



We recently came across some horses, and Margo was very calm. She just sat down, watched for a bit and then, once she'd taken it all in, she was happy to move on. This is how she handles all new situations, and it's fascinating to watch her. Margo has accompanied me to so many different environments including restaurants, fundraising events, garden centres and even the local cinema!
