

New skills

Over the last few months, not much has changed with Margo's personality. She is still as lively, confident, and sassy as ever... just a lot taller! She's such a happy pup and loves to meet people - her tail never stops wagging! When anyone wants to say hello to her, she's so pleased and celebrates with an excited bum wiggle.

I've been training Margo to sit and wait for her food. After hearing the cue 'yep', she eats. This helps to keep her calm and, in the future, will allow her new owner to move out of the way before she dives into dinner. She's picked this up so quickly and is fantastic at it.

Margo has a lot of energy, and we help her use some of it with toys such as Licki mats and snuffle mats, which keep her mind active. These toys encourage her to follow the scent and find the hidden food. It's important that Margo is mentally stimulated as well as physically exercised, she loves playing these games. She's also now

big enough to jump into the back of the car and loves it. I always let Margo jump in the car first otherwise she might squash Vinny, our rehomed guide dog.

I'm pleased to tell you that Margo and I have been able to visit many new places since your last Pupdate. One of the first places we went was to the supermarket; Margo was so curious. She was fascinated with all the new sights and smells and loved all the fuss she got when meeting new people. 
