Advanced training

Emma, Margo's previous trainer, has done an amazing job training her. My job now is to fine-tune Margo's skills, build her confidence in areas it may be lacking, and understand the kind of partner she will suit. I've been adding in more challenges for her to make sure she is confident in her decision-making while guiding.

These include me purposely changing my walking style to encourage Margo to take on more guiding responsibility. For example, I might walk a bit slower or act a bit off balance. I want her to notice this and be able to get me back on track safely. When I first got Margo, she would often look back at me for reassurance, but now she's confident in her guiding decisions. I'm so proud of the progress she's made.

I've also been doing some blindfold walks with Margo. This is when I wear a blindfold and ask her to lead me on a familiar route we've been practising together. A colleague will always be close by to make sure we're both safe. Blindfold walks also encourage Margo to make her own decisions and keep me safe without any help from me.

Perfecting skills

Margo is fantastic on public transport; I've been practising travelling on the London Underground with her, as a potential match could use this mode of transport. She takes it all in her stride and is doing great. She's the perfect size for public transport as she easily tucks away under your legs!

Margo picks things up quickly and enjoys locating objects like chairs and crossing boxes. She has made great progress with her dog distraction, especially barking dogs. She can still sometimes get a bit distracted and stop to look, but she walks past them nicely and quickly refocuses.

Key skills

Did you know our dogs need to learn 37 key skills to qualify as a guide dog? These range from those designed to help with health checks to those more specific to guiding. 'Chin rest' (where we ask the dog to rest their head on a surface so that their ears or eyes can be checked) is an essential welfare skill, while learning to walk with the correct guiding tension is important to ensure they can guide their owner around obstacles safely, without pulling.
