I am currently working with Milo to help him refine his skills and become a fully qualified guide dog. My favourite part of this job is seeing the pups grow in confidence and Milo has been no exception.

Milo has a gorgeous personality and has everyone at training school completely smitten – his playful nature makes him cheeky at times. Milo's love of food can mean he often tries to get his nose in the food bag and have a good sniff for potential treats! Altogether, there really is nothing bad to say about Milo and he truly is a joy to be around.

In the short time he's been at training school Milo has already made lots of progress. He is now wearing his harness, which he has completely accepted and was confident from the first time he tried it on. He even wagged his tail the whole time he was wearing it!





Developing new skills

Milo takes everything in his stride and has been learning basic guiding cues, including stopping at kerbs, finding crossings and walking safely. My focus is now teaching Milo to have better food manners. Milo can find it hard to resist food on the floor, so we have been leaving piles of treats out and rewarding him for ignoring them. He's improved massively and loves getting praise when he's done well!
