My sight loss story started 20 years ago after my second heart attack. Clots in my blood vessels meant that my eyes were starved of oxygen, so I woke up with no central vision. My life completely changed overnight. I'm a motorsport enthusiast. I love rally cars and used to drive them. Not only did my loss of vision mean I had to leave my job, but I also wasn't able to do some of my favourite hobbies.

It took me a long time to accept my sight loss. Adapting to my new way of life was a challenge, as I lost most of my independence. Ten years after losing my central vision, my wife, Anita, and friends finally convinced me to go to an open day at a Guide Dogs centre. It was only then that I learnt how a guide dog can help change your life. This is where my Guide Dogs journey began.

#### **Meeting Moose**

Moose is my second guide dog. My first was a golden retriever/German shepherd called Zelda. Before I had her, I learnt how to use a white cane. I didn't feel confident going out with it, so I only used it when I had to. Zelda opened my world back up.

I used to hate going out, but with a guide dog, I was going out even if I had nowhere to go. It was amazing to feel confident enough to go out by myself again. Zelda is now retired; Moose has some big paws to fill!

Moose and I clicked instantly; Nicola, Moose's trainer, did a fantastic job of matching us. He's such a happy and affectionate dog. I couldn't have asked for a better match to follow Zelda. Partnership training with Moose was great. The training has changed since getting Zelda, and I enjoy the new programme; I find it interesting and can tell the difference when working with Moose. Nicola has been incredible and provided me with lots of guidance. When I'm at home, I work on things Nicola has taught me with Moose, and it's fulfilling to notice the improvements when we're on walks; I'm so proud of him. I used to have pet dogs and trained them in agility. Being able to work with Moose reminds me of this hobby, which is lovely.

#### Life now

Moose settled in quickly, we have a fantastic bond. He always follows me around; I can tell because I hear his tail wagging behind me tapping the walls. We all love him and his friendship with Zelda is heartwarming, however the toy box is always empty now!









#### **Creating new partnerships**

They will look to partner the dog with someone whose needs match the dog's. It's almost like creating a dating profile!
