This way he will learn to make enough room for

himself and his handler, a vital skill to master to become a qualified guide dog.

I'm currently working with Oscar on some complex skills such as 'find the van', finding self-checkouts in supermarkets and locating pedestrian crossings.

by the hustle and bustle, even when we came across some donkeys!


