Hello, it's Iwona here, Jennifer's mother. Ruby has recently qualified as a buddy dog and has been partnered with my daughter, Jennifer.

Jennifer was born prematurely with Cerebral Palsy and is a wheelchair user. A couple of years ago during a visit to the opticians they noticed her sight was getting worse. When Jennifer was eight years old, she was diagnosed with vision impairment.

First steps


Once we received the vision impairment certificate, I did some research and came across Guide Dogs, so I gave them a call to ask about the type of help they offer for children like Jennifer. It wasn't long before we received an invitation to attend a family event in London where we had the opportunity to meet other parents and children with sight loss. A few days later I had another call from Guide Dogs who advised that Jennifer is too young for a guide dog but would be a great applicant for a buddy dog instead - and the rest is history!

Due to COVID-19 it took some time to complete Jennifer and Ruby's partnership, but the whole process was explained to us very well. Buddy dogs are dogs that have been given a career change because guiding wasn't quite right for them. They are like a friend to children with vision impairments and Ruby has helped Jennifer build a sense of fun and trust. When Ruby first arrived in our home, she was a little restless, but after a week, she had fully settled in. Now she refuses to sleep anywhere else but in her big doggy bed in Jennifer's bedroom – they are inseparable!



Life with Ruby

Jennifer and Ruby make a fantastic team. They are both so funny and good with each other – it makes me very happy. Ruby encourages Jennifer to increase her physical activity. They both love playing fetch together and going to the park. The biggest change I've noticed in Jennifer is how much more she likes to be outdoors. Previously, she'd spent a lot of time on her computer but now she likes to remind me when it's time to walk Ruby!
