Rupert is a superb puppy! He has such a friendly personality and is always willing to learn. From the start, nothing has really fazed him - he's just so adaptable. My husband, Les, and I have been working on transport with Rupert, and he's had no problems. When travelling in the car, he settles really well in the boot. There is a harbour close to where we live, so we've been introducing Rupert to boats as well and even taking trips across the river on a ferry. Although his future owner might not need to travel on a ferry, creating a positive association with new and unusual environments is important to ensure that Rupert isn't anxious when encountering new experiences in the future.

New skills

I've also been teaching Rupert the cue 'under', where I sit on a seat and Rupert goes under my legs and lies down. We have built this up slowly using lots of treats and fuss, evolving the skill as Rupert has grasped each part. At first, I just asked Rupert to

lie under my legs. Once he understood that, I asked him to stay and now I can get up from my seat and he'll stay lying down until I give the cue to follow. This skill will be really helpful in the future if Rupert's owner needs to travel on a busy bus or train where there isn't much space; going underneath his owner's legs will keep Rupert safe and out of the way.



New people

Les and I are volunteer fundraisers for Guide Dogs too, so we take Rupert along with us whenever we go to events. He's very good and people love to see him and say hello! We've been teaching Rupert how to greet people calmly without jumping. He picked this up quickly and will now sit by my side until we say he can say hello. This is a great skill to have, especially in tight or busy spaces. People can't believe how well-behaved he is!



Rupert also joins us when we go to the local gym; he comes to yoga on Saturdays and a kids' jujitsu class on Wednesdays. These are very different experiences, but Rupert doesn't bat an eye – he understands that sometimes the gym can be quiet and calm and sometimes chaotic and loud, but he will sit and watch happily regardless.
