new challenges that training school will bring and I can't wait to see him proudly wearing his training harness.

## Practice makes perfect

I've been teaching Spirit skills that will help his future owner. For example, teaching him to 'find the button' in lifts and at pedestrian crossings by pointing with his nose. This way, his future owner will be able to run their hand up his nose and find the button easily.

Spirit can be a little impatient when going through doors or onto public transport. I've been working on teaching him to slow down and take his time and I feel he has started to mature and calm down. It still amazes me how bright he is as it usually









only takes him two or three attempts at something to master it. Practice makes perfect, after all!

## Overcoming challenges

Spirit loves getting out and about and exploring different environments. He even went to see Toy Story 4 at the cinema and made me very proud as, even with the loud noise, he settled down and went to sleep. He has also come along to some fundraising events with

me and coped very well; it's safe to say he likes to be the centre of attention and doesn't like being ignored!

Spirit had a bit of a pigeon problem and would get easily distracted by them. Thanks to our training efforts, he now walks past them.

#### Playful pup


