Refining skills

The recent impact of coronavirus has meant I've needed to find new ways of ensuring Spirit has continued to progress in his training, given that travelling to public places hasn't been possible. Before the social distancing quidelines were introduced, we visited a few different places and used public transport which he handled with confidence. We also did café training; he'd simply flop down underneath the table and go to sleep - he's very patient and always adapts to my pace.

Additionally, I've focused on developing Spirit's existing skills a little further. This included working on 'targeting' various objects, such as post boxes, empty benches and doors which will be extremely useful when quiding a future owner.

A day in the life of Spirit

Spirit had taken to life at training school like a duck to water and also made himself comfortable at his new home with his Boarder. Spirit is a really lovely dog and tries his best; he likes to make people happy and is doing wonderfully so far.

Spirit has shown himself to be incredibly calm and really takes everything on the chin – he never gets fazed by anything unfamiliar. But he definitely has a cheeky side! He's had to be reminded that he doesn't rule the house and he isn't allowed to nap on the sofa, but he's great at following instructions.
