Once lockdown restrictions were eased, Spirit resumed training whilst staying with his Boarder Hannah during the evenings and weekends. Spirit is a very willing dog and doesn't shy away from learning new things. He didn't hesitate to return to training as he's so eager to learn!

Completing training

During lockdown Spirit practised his lead work with Hannah and was given plenty of opportunities to practise his recall when exploring the local fields. During this time Hannah focused on fine tuning Spirit's ability to not get distracted by other dogs playing in the park, as sometimes Spirit would see another pups' toy and want to play with it himself. To combat this, she took some of Spirit's tovs and food with her and would reward him when he didn't get distracted. Spirit improved massively and behaves brilliantly on free runs. I also took Spirit to a café to see how he would deal with some of the noises that he might not have experienced during lockdown. Spirit wasn't fazed at all by other customers and didn't take any notice of people wearing facemasks. Instead, he relaxed underneath the table and had a quick snooze.

Onwards and upwards

I have taken Spirit on walks into town and to navigate through busier areas where it was safe to do so. I'm pleased to say that Spirit has mastered lots of skills and is brilliant at everything he does. Spirit can work in both busy and quieter areas and isn't concerned by large crowds. He particularly enjoys guiding towards pelican crossings! The only area he'd hesitate at is when he comes across a few other dogs while in his harness. This wouldn't stop him though, and he'd always shake off any apprehensions he had.
