I'm very proud to say that Sprout's calm nature and ability to adapt to any new environment means he is now being put forward to begin training!

Sprout has a lovely personality. He is calm in all situations and always wants to please. Whether it's going out in the car or on a walk, Sprout is always so enthusiastic to go out. He is so loving at home, and I've found he loves ice cubes... If he hears some being dispensed from the fridge, he comes running through to the kitchen and head butts me on my bottom until I give him one!

## Staying in different places

Sprout walks well on the lead and is well versed with all the previous skills learnt; I've recently started teaching him how to find a chair. Sprout recently stayed with some fosterers as we were due to go on holiday; this is good practise for pups in training as they can learn to take cues from other people. I was delighted to hear that Sprout's recall was still as good when he was with his fosterers!

We also went to the Lake District for a short break, and Sprout behaved brilliantly in the new surroundings and crowds of people. It was the first time he'd seen swans on a lake and whilst he did initially think the swan would like to say hello, one word from us and Sprout retreated!

## New sights and sounds

Nothing seems to faze Sprout - if any noise makes him jump, he doesn't shy away from it. The Red Arrows flew over our house recently and I ran to check Sprout was OK, but he just looked at me wondering what all the fuss was about!

I took him to the hairdressers recently where there are lots of different noises and smells; I was so amazed by Sprout's calm approach - he just lay there fascinated by other customers having their hair done!

## **Future plans**

Previously I had been concerned about his recall and curiosity, but I'm delighted to say his recall is now reliable. Whilst he's still interested in what's going on around him, he no longer gets distracted and remains focussed.
