Many things have changed since Theo's first Pupdate. He's got a lot bigger!

What's more, his play pal Maple went to training school. We prepared Theo for this change by slowly increasing the time they spent apart, so he was used to not having her around. He was a little sad at first, but now he's loving all the extra attention he gets!

Theo's growing up

In Theo's first Pupdate I mentioned his personality was very calm, but now he's living his teenage years and he's changing a little, getting more confident and active. His favourite toy is a long soft toy snake but he adores rope toys too; Theo and I love to play tug together! Although Theo's becoming more independent, he's still very affectionate, he likes to have cuddles and asks for more with his paw.

New skills, people and places

Overall, Theo's progressing well, nothing really fazes him. He's still very food motivated and would do anything for a tasty treat. Sometimes it takes him a little time to process what I ask him to do, so I need to put in a little effort and repeat the cue a few times.

He can struggle to stay still so he's practising lying down and settling. He's learnt to walk on my left side and sometimes I try to test him and let him walk on my right side, but he doesn't like it, he usually comes back to the left! This will be helpful when he goes to training school as most dogs are taught to quide on the left.

After some hard work, Theo's recall is now pretty good and even if another dog is there, it only takes Theo a few seconds to come back. Theo doesn't know his own strength, so I'm working on making him more aware of it as he can be a little bit boisterous at times. He also started to be a little vocal especially when he sees other dogs on walks, so I'm working on this too. I'm not too worried as he's still very young and most dogs go through this 'teenage' phase!

Theo's been to many places like supermarkets, cafés, pubs, and new outdoor areas where we can have a nice walk. I've also travelled on buses with him. Our next challenge is to go on trains more regularly, so Theo can get to know new sounds and situations.

What is PREP?

Puppy Raising for Excellent Partnerships (PREP) is our bespoke puppyraising programme that guide dog pups follow while living with their puppy raisers. PREP was designed in consultation with volunteers, staff, training behaviour consultants and canine research staff. It's based on Positive Reinforcement Training (PRT) which focuses on rewarding good behaviour and creating positive associations with new experiences. PREP treats each pup as an individual and helps to support their physical, behavioural, and emotional development.
