Puppy raising Willow has given me a sense of purpose. It's lovely being a part of the community. It's always difficult when the pups move on to training school, but it does give you an opportunity to clean your house! Many people think labradoodles don't moult, but they do!

Willow loves free running

Willow is excellent in the house; she is a really easy dog to live with and isn't demanding at all. She's quite happy to settle down and hasn't caused any problems in the house. My last dog before Willow ate five TV remotes! One of Willow's favourite things to do is free running. She loves playing fetch with her toys and loves anything that squeaks or has food inside. Willow is very intuitive and even knows some of her toys by name.

Willow will play with her toys outside and in the kitchen. When we go into the living room she will wait patiently to be let in and lies down nicely in her big bed.

Adjusting training

Recently I have been reinforcing what Willow has been learning – her obedience is very good, and she's mastered the 'sit' and 'stay' verbal cues. These skills need reinforcing all the time so they stay fresh in the pup's mind. We have also been doing Zoom puppy classes – Willow is a star pupil!

Due to lockdown restrictions earlier in the year, we haven't been able to visit many public areas. As a result, Willow can get very excited when meeting other people and dogs. I'm going to work with Willow to overcome this and help her keep calm in social situations.
