Overall Purpose

The scientific research undertaken at Guide Dogs has a significant impact on dog welfare and the effectiveness of Guide Dogs' breeding, training and service provision programmes as well as on the guide dog service and the wellbeing of people with vision impairment. The goal is to provide insightful, timely and actionable research outputs that contribute to Guide Dogs' ability to improve the mobility of people that are living with sight loss through its services. The primary functions of this role are (1) to assist with the development, execution and reporting of research activities focusing on canine behaviour, reproduction and health topics and (2) to support investigations into orientation, mobility and wellbeing, new services or updating existing strategies for the benefit of people who are blind or partially sighted. The role will support the research associates with data collection, data entry and project administration tasks. Depending on specific project needs, the post may involve some work with our customers and external organisations that are carrying out approved research activities on behalf of Guide Dogs.

The goal is insightful, timely and actionable research outputs that contribute to Guide Dogs' ability to improve the mobility of people who are blind and partially sighted through its canine services. Where improvements are identified, the post holder will be expected to present an impact analysis and make appropriate recommendations to management.
