"Hi, I'm Charlotte and I am the Volunteering Coordinator for the Birmingham area. I cover

Birmingham, Worcestershire, Herefordshire, and the majority of Gloucestershire. I am new to Guide Dogs and been in the role since 26th June. I absolutely love animals and previously worked in animal rescue as a volunteer coordinator, but I also



worked on kennels and cattery. Occasionally I am still asked to foster kittens that need that little extra care and love.

"The main responsibilities of my role are to recruit volunteers for varied volunteer roles, I can do this through different mediums which can vary from social media, volunteer bureaus to material distribution. I also do quarterly welcome events, Local Volunteer Awards, organising volunteer socials, attending events, and dealing with volunteer enquiries.

"My days can be very varied which I love, some days I am at a desk contacting local businesses to see if they will advertise a specific volunteer role that I am recruiting for in that area or emailing/speaking to people who have questions about roles. Other days I am exploring areas of the country I have never been too at amazing local events that I wouldn't have had the opportunity to attend before, meeting fabulous volunteers and raising awareness of Guide Dogs!"
