Dear All,

How quickly the year has flown-by, and what a good opportunity for me to extend my sincere thank you for everything you have done for us at Guide Dogs. With your help this year in the South East, we have supported many dogs at start of their journeys and into their future careers.

- Placed 211 puppies in puppy raising homes (with a few more to come before the end of the year!)
- Supplied 150 dogs to the next stage of training
- 33 of our dogs entered the breeding programme
- In the South East, 66 dogs have qualified as guide dogs (with more to qualify before the end of the year)
- And finally, 11 dogs have gone on to be wonderful buddy dogs

None of this would have been possible without your commitment, kindness and often patience! A huge thank you for everything you have done in 2024 which has allowed us to achieve all the above. We are very lucky.

Something I am most proud of in 2024 is our monthly learning sessions, run by our wonderful Puppy Development Advisors (PDAs). We have been blown away by the number of you taking the time to attend these sessions and really hope you have found them interesting.
