Hi all, Leah Rogers here, and I am the Puppy Raising Operations Manager for the South West.

Puppy Raising Operations Manager message

As we are now well into 2025 we have had a chance to reflect on how 2024 went and the success that we had in the year.

In our region we qualified 88 partnerships through our teams in Exeter, Southampton, Bristol and Cardiff.

We had 223 pups enter training and placed 245 pups onto our puppy schemes. We also had 20 dogs go into our breeding programme.

We are very proud of all the hard work that our volunteers and Puppy Development Advisors (PDAs) put into supporting our pups to become life changers, whether that's in training or through the breeding programme. Congratulations to you all on making 2024 such a successful year!

Looking forward now to 2025, we are going to focus on bringing back the basics for our puppies, including dog obedience and letting everyone know how this will better support our guide dog pups on their journey into training.

Obedience responses are the basis of all our training and there are many ways to achieve this, like teaching the puppy to wait before they go through the doorway, pause before they negotiate the stairs, or just a simple sit/wait on the lead. One way we can help you with this is to reintroduce these obedience responses in your puppy classes and socials; this will support your learning through Kallidus and enable you to practice in a safe environment with support from your PDAs so look out for more information about this in the coming months. Our PDAs look forward to supporting you with all of this going forward.
