We appreciate you reaching out to your PDA to offer a temporary home for a short while, an overlap or to repeat puppy raise, in some cases helping out when you had planned a well deserve break.

PDA Jayne Allen will be going back to her Guide Dog Trainer role at the end of August. when she intakes your puppy into training in Atherton is a blessing in disguise.


Puppy raiser recruitment event

Guide dog puppies score a visit to Chester Football Club to help achieve their goal of becoming life-changers



A group of special puppies from Cheshire recently visited Chester's football stadium, to help achieve their goal of becoming life-changing guide dogs.

The seven guide dog puppies, called Helen, Hattie, Barlow, Air, Comet, Sam and Indigo, were invited to the football club as part of their guide dog training. The goal for the session was to get them used to busy and noisy football stadiums.

Each pup was accompanied by their volunteer puppy raiser who supports them for the first 12 months of their life, teaching basic commands and helping them get used to different environments, before they begin their specialised guide dog training.

As part of the special training session, puppies were able to build their confidence on stairs, around novel gates, turning round in small spaces between the seating, getting used to Tannoy announcements and crowd



noise such as clapping, while experiencing a novel environment that they may encounter as a guide dog in the future.

The fun puppy class also included opportunities for the puppies to learn to ignore distractions, such as moving footballs and people running around, and practice settling at a seat with their puppy raiser.

The session was led by Puppy Development Advisors, Lisa Cooper and Beth McDonald, who cover the Cheshire area.

Lisa said: "It was such a fantastic learning opportunity for our puppies to experience a completely new environment, and to also gradually expose them to the sights and sounds of a football stadium. We aim to make learning fun for our pups and our puppy raisers.

"We are very grateful to Chester FC for allowing us to use their stadium for our training session. Thank you!"

Puppy raiser Val, who is currently looking after her eleventh guide dog puppy, a Golden Doodle called Barlow, said: "It was a great atmosphere at Chester FC. It's been a really positive experience for the puppies."

Albert Davies, Chairman of Chester FC, said: "We're a community football club and we're keen to get involved with charities, so something like this is really important.

"It's fantastic to hear that everyone had such a good day. Hopefully this something we can continue to do again here at the stadium."
