We are fast approaching some festive holidays such as Halloween, Diwali and Christmas, please look out for tips on how to support your pups during these festive periods. I have included below a few group activities and festive classes that have been happening in our Worcestershire and Lincolnshire schemes.

It's hard to believe that we are nearing the end of 2024 and what a great year this has been in puppy raising and in the Midlands region.

As I write this newsletter, we currently have 323 pups in our region. And so far, this year, we've already placed 272 pups, which is incredible. This could not have been achieved without your support, effort and commitment to us as volunteers and for that I am so grateful.
