

Scotland and Northern Ireland region: puppy raising update October 2024

The year seems to be flying by, and as we navigate the darker nights there are a few considerations to think about. There is a lot of novelty to come for our pups: Halloween, bonfire night and then all the excitement that the preparation for Christmas brings.

If appropriate for your pup's age and stage, think about how you can expose your puppy safely to the changes they may see. Having a look at the end of a Halloween aisle in the supermarket or passing that decorated house down the street in daylight hours, could be a good start.

Thinking about the weather and lighting may seem simple, but these can have a huge impact on a puppy. Have you walked your pup in low light before? If appropriate for their age you could do short street walks at dusk, letting your pup see the world that might not be as clear to them, quite literally, in a new light. Sounds may seem to come out of nowhere and lights may seem brighter, shadows and blowing leaves may suddenly change the feel of a street, so building your puppy's confidence will help them navigate this change of season.
