Help us make a difference this school sports day!

Fund Race is a new integrated fundraising and awareness campaign launching in February 2023 for both primary and secondary schools to include into their existing sports day activities. It was developed after hearing Guide Dogs staff share their experiences of growing up with a vision impairment, and how their schools successfully adapted sports day. Our aim is to sign up around 1,700 schools or youth groups via our website from February to the end of May. Each school will receive a free downloadable or postal pack with an assembly plan, learning resources and fundraising ideas. Addnoddau Cymraeg ar gael - Welsh resources are available too.

Key messages to the public

- Fund Race is a sports day challenge that everyone can enjoy.
- Make Fund Race part of your school's sports day and raise vital funds for Guide Dogs, while also learning more about life for children with sight loss.
- Fund Race is a track race for students, parents, and teachers - with a twist! Everyone in the race is blindfolded and uses a rope as their guide.
- In the UK today, there are around 28,000 children who have a vision impairment. We've created this challenge to start important conversations about sight loss and being more inclusive and accessible.



- We're best known for our incredible guide dogs. But we also support thousands of children and young people across the UK.
- Every pound raised by **Fund Race** will make a difference. Just £48 could buy a child a custom-made, large print book so they can read a paper book just like their friends.

No sweat required to get involved

All schools will be emailed in February and paid marketing starts in March, but you can signpost any group to sign up via **guidedogs.org.uk/FundRace** to receive our free downloadable or postal resource pack, specific to their age range:

- Guidance about organising the event and fundraising ideas.
- An assembly plan including learning about accessibility and inclusion, with a PowerPoint and YouTube videos of children and young people with sight loss sharing their own stories.
- Information on how to invite a Guide Dogs speaker.
- Lesson resources including the all-important blindfold to cut out and decorate with an inclusivity pledge. The pledge can also be written on a take-home postcard to show parents/guardians which includes a reminder about regular eye tests for children.
- Editable posters, stickers, certificates and more!

Top tips for schools to run up funds

Asking race participants to pay to enter.

Running a refreshment stall for all those thirsty racegoers (and spectators)!





Asking for donations at the event or via a **JustGiving** page which can be set up at **justgiving.com/campaign/FundRace**.

Setting up blindfolded mini-games or obstacle courses, with a small fee to join in the inclusive fun.

Schools and groups that pay in their fundraising total will receive a **Guide Dogs Champion for Active Inclusion** accreditation to display.
