

Guide Dogs 90 Appeal: Celebrating 90 years of life-changing services this October

The annual Guide Dogs Appeal is back again this October and is linking with our 90th anniversary celebrations.

What is Guide Dogs 90 Appeal?

Our annual Guide Dogs Appeal takes on a special theme this year to coincide with our 90th anniversary. We will be celebrating 90 years of Guide Dogs by asking people to take on a 90 themed fundraising activity - as an individual or group.

Key messages to the public

- This October join thousands of people making the Guide Dogs 90
 Appeal their own! Walk 90 km, play 90 minutes of charity
 football, wash 90 cars, or bake and sell 90 cakes. However you
 want to raise money, your support will mean we can help people
 with sight loss now, and for the next 90 years.
- Guide Dogs celebrates its birthday on 6 October, but you can hold your fundraiser any time that suits you.
- People with sight loss are likely to encounter unemployment, depression, loneliness, and financial insecurity. But by supporting the Guide Dogs 90 Appeal you can help people with sight loss live the life they choose.
- By raising £90 your £90 could pay for an afternoon of a guide dog's training. Your donation can help us to train the next generation of guide dogs so we can be here for people with sight loss, now and in the future.

This fundraising activity is entirely through Facebook with the opportunity to join our **90km for Guide Dogs Facebook group** to share your photos and updates. Supporters who register on the group and set up a Facebook fundraiser, will receive a free Guide Dogs bandana to wear on their walk.

If you aren't on Facebook or would prefer to organise a walking fundraiser offline, we recommend using our sponsorship forms. Please note, we are unable to send bandanas to any fundraisers not on Facebook, but you would be eligible to claim a limited-edition Guide Dogs 90 pin badge. Full terms and conditions apply.
