## Get everyone involved with our Treasure Hunt to find our 12 life-changing guide dogs.

It costs £8 a day to support a guide dog partnership. Every penny you raise will help us fund more life-changing guide dog partnerships.

Whether you choose to do it at school or in your local community, our Treasure Hunt is a great way to introduce children to what guide dogs are all about and help ensure that when someone loses their sight, they don't lose their freedom as well.

## What you'll need at each venue selling entry forms

- A Treasure Hunt poster with your contact details
- Money collecting device decorated jam jars work a treat!
- A stack of entry forms marked with your suggested donation, location clues, prize details and contact information
- An enclosed 'post box' for completed entry forms – why not use an empty shoe box decorated with wrapping paper?

### Your Step-by-Step Guide

Organising a Treasure Hunt for Guide Dogs is easy! Here's everything you need to do:

- Decide a time for your treasure hunt
- Choose where you are going to place your treasure hunt posters – you will need 12 different locations
- If you are doing this in your community, contact the venues to see if they would be willing to be one of your 12 places. These could be shops, restaurants or cafes, businesses like hairdressers or even yets and banks
- Decide where your participants will be able to get their entry forms. This could be in every venue you have one of your 12 dogs
- Decide on a prize for your treasure hunt something fun or sweet that the kids will love?
- Create a list of location clues to help the kids find the 12 dogs
- Use our editable Entry Form and fill out with location clues, prize details and your contact information
