and despite initially being hesitant, after investigating, Alfie walked over them wonderfully. He is very enthusiastic to try new things and we are very proud of him.

After a day of training, Alfie loves to play and relax, although he tends to be keener to play than my two pet dogs, Otto and Jaffa! We often go on free runs

down by the river where Alfie loves paddling in the water, but he isn't too sure when his feet can't touch the bottom! Tug-of-war is still Alfie's favourite game although he is very strong so he often wins the game quickly!
