I've been registered blind since birth due to a condition known as Reinopathy of Prematurity. I had some slight vision remaining until I was around 20 years old but today, I don't have any vision remaining at all.

As a child I was scared of dogs and so a guide dog wasn't the first option for me. Guide Dogs provided me with long cane training so that I could still get about on my own but, to put it bluntly, I hated the cane! I kept walking into things and it just didn't agree with me. Although I am not the kind of person to give

up easily, I had started to avoid using it and often the only time I would leave the house was to pop to the local shops. I had no independence and it was a very difficult time for me.

A life-changing moment

My mum got chatting to a man who had a guide dog and we were invited to a local Guide Dogs event, to meet guide dog owners and their dogs. We had the opportunity to talk to people who shared their experiences of having a guide dog. After meeting so many lovely dogs I realised I no longer feared them and hearing about all of the amazina experiences they had given people, I thought 'wow, this really is something I need to do!'. So, I got my first guide dog in 1976 and have never looked back! Alfie is my 9th guide dog and what a little life-changer he is - I can't begin to explain how much of a difference he makes to my mobility, confidence and independence.







Part of the family

Alfie and I carried out our partnership training in Cardiff over a few weeks. This training reminded me of all the commands and knowledge I need to ensure Alfie can guide me safely and successfully. I very much enjoyed the training and it set us up for a long and happy partnership together.

Alfie settled into life at home, with my wife and I, straight away.

He has such a laid-back nature which is useful as we have a big family who visit us often, including 4 children and 3 grandchildren. It can be a little busy here at times but Alfie loves the children and always soaks up the attention!

Confidence and independence

The biggest difference Alfie makes to my life is the confidence I have to get out and visit new places. I love to go on a big walk every day and I couldn't do that with the cane. but now I can go anywhere as I have complete trust and faith in Alfie as my guide.

He's enabled me to continue having an active lifestyle and busy social life - and my wife doesn't worry when I am out on my own anymore! Soon we are going on a family holiday to centre parcs and I just can't wait. Alfie gives me so much confidence and independence, which means I can truly enjoy visiting new places and spending time with those I love.
