

I was diagnosed with a genetic degenerative eye disorder in my early twenties and today, I can only see vague shapes and colours in my right eye and my left eye just has some narrow central vision remaining. Due to this, I can sometimes be quite hesitant when walking on my own. However, my wife has said that when I have Bolt by my side, I walk as if my sight has not been affected at all – how incredible! I have complete confidence that if Bolt believes the path to be clear, then it is.

Without the support of people like you and Guide Dogs, I wouldn't have Bolt in my life and I wouldn't know the incredible freedom and independence that owning a guide dog gives you.

Bolt felt very much at home from the word go, however our pet dog Murphy and pet cat ZeeZee felt very differently, taking them a little while to realise that Bolt was here to stay. Hilariously ZeeZee now rules the roost, with Bolt reluctantly accepting her rule!
